DISCUSSION/ACTION

5.1 Charter Council Liaison - Trisha Atehortua (absent) Rachel C. reported that the Board did discuss what the rest of the year may look like. They discussed whether Fridays would continue as Distance Learning or be half days for example. The teachers will now discuss this before it will be brought back to the board. Nothing has been determined on this yet.

5.2 Administration Liaison - Rachel Ceja - nothing to report.

5.3 Faculty Liaison- Nick Meier - Alex Archer will be updating new Faculty and Staff profiles (located in the Blueroom). 42 school days left. There is a lot of work to do between now and then. Testing has started for some classes and will be happening soon for other classes.

5.4 Treasurer- Franki Boisseree - Totals PC Fund: \$19,716.27 Garden Club: \$872.70. \$868.70 of the Garden Fund is from the Raley Grant, which is set to expire soon. 6.1 May Faire Planning- A. Chambless / Nick Meier

Dancing for 1.5 hours isn't feasible, but the drive around event is still being coordinated from 11 am to 12:30. Bands are being contacted to see if they are available to play. Some recordings are being coordinated to distribute. Current emphasis is on gift preparation. Decorations will be simple in nature and will comprise of poster boards and materials we already have. Goal for next year is to have more festival activities.

<u>Gift Basket Vision</u> - Books from the Bookstore, Gardening gifts, Earrings, Window Star Kit, Ceramic Plate. This is a fundraising component of the May Faire. Angie E. asked when it would go public? Each \$10 spent will go toward a ticket. Amanda discussed that there may be an electronic way to assign tickets and electronically select a winner.

Angie E.- Shared the sunflower seeds from the school garden and the flyer attached that was handed out for the Harvest Festival earlier this year. Something similar can be prepared for the May Faire. Karissa will provide a few ways to celebrate spring. A writeup can also be included to discuss the history behind the seed ball/bomb idea.

Angie E. - Would like help with making the seed/gift. Nick M. reminded the PC of the price of \$30 for a 25 lb block of clay. Amber P. has 2 lb of wildflower seeds to contribute. The seed bomb recipe is to be confirmed.

Volunteers - About 6 to 10 people are needed to sign up for setup. Amanda would like to meet with Angie so see what materials are needed to setup and decorate for the event..

<u>Seed Ball Details</u>: Amanda will send out a Doodlepool for something on April 16th/17th for the seed ball/gift preparations. Need to order materials of clay. Nick M. will order the materials for the clay. Nick M. will make a quarter sheet to send home with the students.

Rachel C. Has Staff meetings at 9 am Fridays if there are needs for helping make seed balls during this time.

Amanda would be willing to sit at the table during the drive through for purchasing tickets for the Material Donation Fund / Gift Basket Raffle - if needed.

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Nick M. reminded the PC that the Acorn comes out weekly (on Wednesdays). Angle E. will work on displaying these details on the Sandwich/Chalk Boards, which can begin before the Acorn comes out as well.

Nick M. will work to see if a few teachers are willing to also contribute digital format songs to share with the Blue Oak Parent Community.

<u>Seed Ball/Bomb Recipe from Sarah Eblin</u>: soil, clay, seeds and water. There are a million recipes online, all of them are good. The ratio is about 1:1, clay to soil. You don't need a ton of seeds, and you add water as needed. I gave each student a fist sized ball of clay, the same amount of soil, and a 1/2 tsp of seeds. You can use clay powder or any earth based clay, I used crayola but bulk clay for a ceramics studio might be cheaper. The soil can be pretty much anything, The SEEDS need to be native to Chico or we run the risk of introducing invasive species into our parks and greenways. Floral native nursery is where I bought my seeds."
