We got all the way around the circle and we were out of time and they said, "No, let us do it again, but go in the opposite direction." So, the next day we did it in both directions. I was so impressed with their kindness towards one another and their knowledge of how to impart goodness to one another. It is in these moments that I absolutely love teaching.

One of my students started referring to me as "My Liege" today during math. As in, "My Liege, I have a question." So I responded with, "Yes, peon, in a moment." Eventually, they asked me what peon meant and was delighted when I gave them the definition.
