#### **Independent Study**

- To request an Independent Study packet for your student(s), please email <u>attendance@blueoakcharterschool.org</u>.
- The front desk will email the parent/guardian to confirm the request.
- The packet will be ready for pick up at the front desk after school the day before the Independent Study starts.
- When students return to campus, they have 5 days to turn the packet in.
- The packet must be complete, signed, and dated by a parent/guardian and given to the **front desk**.
- If Independent Study is taken out and not returned, the student can only take out another packet once the prior packet is returned to the front office, completed and signed.
- If this process is not followed, the student is at risk of being marked absent for the time missed and may not qualify to take out more Independent Study within the school year.
