Payments: Your payment must be sent to the payment address shown on your statement and must be received by 5 p.m. local time at that address to be credited as of the day it is received. Payments we receive after 5 p.m. will not be credited to your Account until the next day. Permission for Electronic Withdrawal: (1) When you send a check for payment, you give us permission to electronically withdraw your payment from your deposit or other asset account. We will process checks electronically by transmitting the amount of the check, routing number, account number and check serial number to your financial institution, unless the check is not processable electronically or a less costly process is available. When we process your check electronically, your payment may be withdrawn from your deposit or other asset account as soon as the same day we receive your check, and you will not receive that cancelled check with your financial account statement. If we cannot collect the funds electronically we may issue a draft against your deposit or other asset account for the amount of the check. (2) By using Pay By Computer, Pay By Phone or any other electronic payment service of ours, you give us permission to electronically withdraw funds from the deposit or other asset account you specify in the amount you request. Payments using such services of ours received after 8:00 p.m. MST may not be credited until the next day.

How We Calculate Your Balance: We use the Average Daily Balance (ADB) method (including new transactions) to calculate the balance on which we charge interest on your Account. Paying Interest: Your due date is at least 25 days after the Closing Date of each billing period. We will not charge you interest on your purchases if you pay the New Balance by the due date each month. We will charge you interest on balance transfers (unless otherwise disclosed) beginning on the transaction date. You can avoid paying interest on the Amount Above the Credit Limit by paying your Minimum Payment Due before the closing date of the month in which it is due. See your Cardmember Agreement for further details.

Foreign Currency Charges: If you make a Charge in a foreign currency, we will convert it into US dollars on the date we or our agents process it. **We will charge a fee of 2.70% of the converted US dollar amount.** We will choose a conversion rate that is acceptable to us for that date, unless a

particular rate is required by law. The conversion rate we use is no more than the highest official rate published by a government agency or the highest interbank rate we identify from customary banking sources on the conversion date or the prior business day. This rate may differ from rates in effect on the date of your charge. Charges converted by establishments (such as airlines) will be billed at the rates such establishments use.

Credit Balance: A credit balance (designated CR) shown on this statement represents money owed to you. If within the six-month period following the date of the first statement indicating the credit balance you do not request a refund or charge enough to use up the credit balance, we will send you a check for the credit balance within 30 days if the amount is \$1.00 or more.

Credit Reporting: We may report information about your Account to credit bureaus. Late payments, missed payments, or other defaults on your Account may be reflected in your credit report.

Billing Dispute Procedures

What To Do If You Think You Find A Mistake On Your Statement

If you think there is an error on your statement, write to us at:

In your letter, give us the following information:

- *Account information:* Your name and account number.

- *Dollar amount:* The dollar amount of the suspected error.

- *Description of Problem:* Describe what you believe is wrong and why you believe it is a mistake.

- At least 2 business days before an automated payment is scheduled, if you want to stop payment on the amount you think is wrong.

You must notify us of any potential errors in writing. You may call us, but if you do we may not follow these procedures and you may have to pay the amount in question.

What Will Happen After We Receive Your Letter

When we receive your letter, we will do two things:

1. Within 30 days of receiving your letter, we will tell you that we received your letter. We will also tell you if we have already corrected the error.

2. We will investigate your inquiry and will either correct the error or explain to you why we believe the bill is correct.

While we investigate whether or not there has been an error:

- We will not try to collect the amount in question.

- The charge in question may remain on your statement, and we may continue to charge you interest on that amount.

- While you do not have to pay the amount in question, you are responsible for the remainder of your balance.

- We can apply any unpaid amount against your credit limit.

After we finish our investigation, one of two things will happen:

- If we made a mistake: You will not have to pay the amount in question or any interest or other fees related to that amount.

- If we do not believe there was a mistake: You will have to pay the amount in question, along with applicable interest and fees. We will send you a statement of the amount you owe and the date payment is due. We may report you as delinquent if you do not pay the amount we think you owe.

Summary of the Blue Oak Charter School - Exit Survey Analysis:

Key Findings from Exits from 6/1/23 to May 31, 2023

- A total of 35 students exited the school during this period.
- The most common reason was transferring to Chico Country Day School (8 students).
- Other common reasons included:
 - Moving to a different local school (5 students),
 - Homeschooling (5 students),
 - And family relocation (4 students).
- Several students exited due to changing family situations or parent/student dissatisfaction without a specific reason provided.
- The majority of exits (23 out of 35) occurred at the end of the 2022-23 school year on June 1, 2023.
- However, there were also a significant number of mid-year exits, with the latest on May 31, 2024.
- A few students had sibling connections, and there were instances of multiple siblings from the same family exiting.

Key Findings from Exits from 6/1/24 to current:

- A total of 33 students exited during this period.
- Again, the most common reason was transferring to Chico Country Day School (8 students).
- Other common reasons included:
 - Moving out of state (3 students),
 - Moving to a different local district (3 students),
 - And family relocation (3 students).
- A few students exited for more specific reasons like seeking greater academic rigor or due to anxiety issues.
- The majority of exits (23 out of 33) occurred at the end of the 2023-24 school year on June 6, 2024.
- A small number of students exited mid-year, with the latest on November 8, 2024.

In summary, while Blue Oak experienced some student turnover during these periods, the primary reasons were families transferring to other local schools, homeschooling, or relocating. The school maintained relatively stable enrollment overall, with the majority of exits happening at the end of the school year. However, the data also indicates some mid-year departures due to family circumstances or dissatisfaction.

Dear Vicki Wonacott:

California Education Code § 1240 requires the County Superintendent or designee visit schools identified for Williams Settlement Monitoring and send the resulting report to district governing boards. This report serves as both the October quarterly report and the November annual report for the fiscal year 2024-25, as required pursuant to the Williams Settlement.

On October 8, 2021, Governor Newsom approved Assembly Bill 599 directing California Department of Education to develop a new list of schools, including charters, based upon the following criteria:

- All schools identified for comprehensive support and improvement (CSI) and additional targeted support and improvement (ATSI) pursuant to the federal Every Student Succeeds Act.
- All schools where 15% or more of the teachers are holders of any authorization that is a lesser certification than a preliminary or clear California teacher credential.

The new list of identified schools for the 2023-24 school year included Blue Oak Charter School.

The BCOE Williams review team site visit with the charter school was an extremely positive and inspiring experience. Blue Oak Charter School site staff involved in the visits were friendly, helpful, and dedicated to supporting all learners at their site.

The purpose of our visit as specified in California Education Code § 1240 and revised in AB 599 was to ensure:

Instructional Materials

there were sufficient district-adopted, standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials visible and/or documented in all classrooms visited. Where applicable, there was sufficient access to internet connections and instructional devices. A plan developed by the LEA to assure access to a device and the internet for all students was filed with the county office.

School Facilities

There are no facility conditions that “pose an emergency or urgent threat to the health or safety of pupils or staff.”

School Accountability Report Card (SARC)

The schools' SARCs provided accurate data related to instructional material and facility maintenance.

Teacher Misassignments and Teacher Vacancies

Teacher monitoring reports are now completed through the new California Statewide Assignment Accountability System (CalSAAS) set up by AB 1219. Data regarding misassignments and vacancies from these reports should be publicly available in December of each year and will be reported on subsequent quarterly Williams reports.

The findings of our visit are summarized below:



The CSPP Coordinator, Caren Lehe:

1. Hosted a **North State Community School Site visit** on 11/12/24. Apx. 15-20 visitors from all over the north state region came together to see Blue Oak Charter School (BOCS) and Butte County Community School (BCCS) - Community Schools in Action. Our goal for these visits was to engage in collaborative discussions that highlighted each school's progress, celebrate achievements, and explore opportunities to enhance student outcomes. Blue Oak highlighted primary reading infused with the arts (Pillar 2: Expanded Learning Time and Opportunities).

Visiting Districts from Gridley, Oroville, Palermo, Paradise, Chico, Willows, Orland, Red Bluff, Yreka as well as Shasta and Siskiyou Counties. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive:

2. **Advisory Committee Update:** I am very happy to announce and welcome Board Member and Community Partners, Donna Kreskey and Emma Todd as our newest members of our CEI/Advisory Team! Both have officially accepted to serve on the team for the remainder of the year.

On Oct. 24th our Committee flew down to Anaheim, CA for our first PLLN Event of the year. While there we reflected on our current "problem of practice" (PoP) and mapping out our community schools work thus far. *Where we've been and where we are going.*



3. **Land Blessing** – Confirmed that Elder Dennis Ramirez, *Mechoopda Tribal Council Chairman*, elected 12/2007 – current, will be performing our upcoming Land Blessing for our new school site on 12/5/24. Envisioning school-wide invitation to parents, staff and students to participate. I sent out a Parent Square notification on Friday 11/15/24. (See attached)
4. **Educational Partnership Opportunity - Mechoopda Tribe:** Susan and I met with members of the Tribal Council on Friday 11/15/24 to thank them for agreeing to do our Land Blessing and to ask for their collaboration on our Land Acknowledgment. One that can be used school wide. We provided a copy of the Land Acknowledgement that was co-written by Mrs. Sheila Moss and her prior 4th grade class.

We also engaged in talks around firsthand education on Native American Culture and the Mechoopda Tribe Heritage. Though this was a subject they were also passionate about they just do not have the funding or members who could support this partnership at this time. However, we were given names of others whom I will follow-up with about this potential opportunity. We also invited them to visit our school. They were excited for the invitation. They will contact me when the Land Acknowledgment and all we were proposing is presented to their Tribal Council for approval.

5. **Día de los Muertos Celebration-** Parent led presentations on the true [meaning](#) of Dia de los Muertos on 10/31/24 for all grades. Students, caregivers and staff helped create the school's **ofrenda** which as you can tell was a beautiful success. Participants brought photos of loved ones and pets who had passed. Some wrote letters and others brought items to share and put on display.



6. **Thanksgiving Food Drive** –We've been collecting nonperishable food and grocery gift cards for families in need. So far 5 confirmed families will be accepting our Thanksgiving Dinner Pkg. Families will pick up after school on the last day before break.
7. **Christmas Giving Tree** – We have already started collecting family names so our tree can go up right after Thanksgiving break. Unwrapped gift donations for families. Many families have signed up already!
